1. Attendees and Apologies

2. Minutes of the last meeting and any matters arising (circulate)

3. Feedback on previous events:
a. Virtual Bingo - $£ 216$ raised was raised, there are no additional expenses.
b. Sunflower seeds - These have been well received. Marie has raised awareness of it today on Facebook.
c. Half-term Alphabet Trail - Unfortunately, this did not prove to be that popular we only had about 4 or 5 entries. There was a small donation raised.
4. Ideas for future events:
a. Fen Gallop/Summer Fete -

- The Fen Gallop going ahead, but we have decided not to do the summer fete alongside. There will be a beer tent and the Scouts are going to do a BBQ and the Girl Guides will do teas and Coffees. We have also booked an ice-cream van.
- At the moment there are 254 entries, however we are hoping to sell all 500 entries prior to the event. We are keeping to $50 \%$ capacity on the course.
- We will need marshals on the course.
- There will a new trophy for the 4-mile race, as a result of the donation received by the WSA last year. This will be for the fastest WPS girl and boy.
- We will be looking for marshals to help with the race.

f. Any other ideas?
- ACTION: Marie to contact honeypots to see about supporting their leavers party.
- Pet competition in the Autumn term?
- Hold a class (and adult) bakeoff where age groups are assigned a recipe (bake off technical challenges) We would charge people to enter who would then send photographs in. The WSA agreed to wait until Autumn and check whether the horticultural show is going ahead.
- We have a parent in reception who is a cycling mechanic and is happy to run bike checks and bike services to support the safer cycling campaign. Becky will put him in touch with Tom M so the WSA can raise awareness and we will get a \% of the profits made.
- ACTION: Catherine to talk to Michelle Lenk about books from the book warren.

5. Funding requests:

- Reception trip to wicken fen ( $£ 5$ per head) - The WSA approved this.
- Yr $1 \& 2$ trip to Hunstanton ( $£ 5$ per head) - The WSA approved this.
- $\operatorname{Yr} 3 \& 5$ to St Albans ( $£ 5$ per head) - The WSA approved this.

6. Any other business:
a. Second-hand uniform

- There is not much stock at the moment, therefore not being advertised.
- ACTION: Becky to see what logo'd stuff the school has and to let Susan know.
b. Swimming pool
- The WSA would like to run swimming pool sessions this term.
- However, if we want to do mixed year groups - there can only be 9 children in the pool, we are likely to need to charge the helpers.
- Individual year groups are difficult.
- The main issue is resus training and having enough volunteers.
- There also needs to be more regular testing of the pool and more checks and more chemicals.
- The school will be using the pool during school so all children will have an opportunity to swim.
- ACTION: Marie to work with Becky to send out a school email to see if there is any parent interest in becoming volunteers.
- ACTION: Becky to confirm whether there will be an issue in terms of toilets or after school club use.
- The WSA agreed that we would charge $£ 3$ per child with a $50 \%$ discount for volunteers.
- We would use a sign-up sheet outside with 9 spaces to confirm who is swimming when.
- ACTION: Becky to confirm the date for resus training and whether the school can be used for the training.
