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| Emergency | Something serious or dangerous that you need help with straight away. |
| Danger/Dangerous | Something which is unsafe and could harm or injure you. |
| 999 | The number we can call in an emergency. |
| Current location | The place where you are now. |
| Rescue | Save someone from a dangerous or difficult situation. |

| Key things we will learn |
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| Basic fire safety rules. -Never play with fire. -Stop, drop and roll. -Never hide if there is a fire, shout and be seen. -Stay low to escape the smoke. -Get out and stay out, find a safe meeting place. How and when to make a 999 call. -Recognising the number 9 and where to find it on a phone. -Our own address / explaining current location. -Speaking clearly to explain an emergency situation, as well as our own name, address and age. -Listening to the instructions the call handler may give. How to recognise and identify different Emergency Services using their uniforms and transport/vehicles. |
